IDFTA 2004 Conference Information and Schedule

BOLZANO (BOZEN), ITALY, MARCH 1-4, 2004

he IDFTA 2004 conference will be held March 1-4, 2004, in Bolzano (Bozen), Italy. The South Tyrol region is famous for its modern apple orchards and state-of-the-art warehouses, its marketing programs and its beautiful setting in the mountain valleys of the Alps of northern Italy. The nearby Dolomites have outstanding hiking and skiing. In the South Tyrol region, both German (Bozen) and Italian (Bolzano) are spoken. The IDFTA conference will have simultaneous translation of English, Italian and German. The conference will be held at the Messe Bozen (Fiera Bolzano) conference facilities and the adjacent Four Point Sheraton Hotel (e-mail info@4p-sheraton-bolzano.it, fax 39-0471-242111). The conference will include two days of orchard and warehouse visits, two days of educational sessions, a day of touring in Bolzano for accompanying person and an awards banquet.

The South Tyrol industry in northern Italy annually produces about 1 million metric tonnes of apples, which is about half the total production of Italy and about half the production of Washington State. There are 40,000 acres of apples with typical orchard size being 10 acres.

The apple orchards are planted with very high quality branched nursery trees at densities from 2500 to 3500 trees/acre. Important varieties are Golden Delicious (half total production), Gala, Fuji and Pink Lady. Cone-shaped trees are trained to a height of 10 to 12 feet. The trees receive more training than pruning and have a calm appearance. South Tyrolean orchardists believe that the best way to restrict growth is to produce apples.

The two-day educational sessions will feature speakers from around the world and will emphasize European experts. Many topics from production techniques to marketing will be included. Two themes will be applied—tree

physiology and new European apple varieties. The physiology session will apply knowledge of tree physiology to producing branched trees, to crop load management (thinning), to tree training (to achieve a calm tree) and nutrition. Speakers will describe their experiences with the many recently released European apple varieties.

The 2-day industry tours will feature outstanding orchards, tree training demonstrations, orchard equipment and a modern warehouse.

It is possible to travel to the conference independently (not as part of one of the tours listed below) by making your own travel and accommodation arrangements and registering for the conference. It will be possible to register for the conference at the IDFTA web site <www.idfta.org>.

Two tour options are provided for those who wish to have their travel details and accommodation arranged for them or who wish to extend their travel with visits to additional fruit districts and tourist sites. Tour Option 1 (8 days) includes air and bus travel, accommodation and registration for the IDFTA conference, while Tour Option 2 (15 days) includes the same activities as Tour Option 1 plus additional visits in the Bodensee fruit district in Germany and the Po Valley fruit region in Italy (see itineraries below). Tour prices include all breakfasts, IDFTA Conference registration, orchard tours and banquet. Tour price does not include cost of transportation to/from your home to the US gateway cities. Although not expected, tour prices are subject to change due to currency fluctuations and changes to the itinerary.

Feb. 29 (Sun.) Travel by bus south through the Alps and over the Brenner Pass to Bolzano (Bozen), South Tyrol, Italy. Overnight Four Point Hotel Sheraton adjacent to the Messe Bozen conference facilities, Bolzano.
